About the Voting Process... While you may vote by mail, the most secure way is **in person** at a [Vote Center](#)*. Complete the ballot you were mailed and take it with you. Check in, then the poll worker will give you a secrecy sleeve for your ballot, which you will take to the checkout station. The worker there will slip your ballot into the ballot box. You may also surrender your mail ballot (be sure it is destroyed) and complete a fresh ballot using the ballot marking device. This merely prints your ballot choices. Review the printed ballot and then take it to the checkout station.
